The City of La Crosse Police Parking Utility reserves the right to refuse or revoke any and all Residential Permits.

LA CROSSE RESIDENTIAL PARKING PERMIT GUIDELINES

1. You have no outstanding parking tickets; and
2. You have a parking time zone established for the side of the street on which you live; and
3. Your block is zoned at least 50% residential and multiple dwelling; and
4. You have a valid driver license; and
5. You are a homeowner or direct relative of the homeowner for the address you are applying for; or
6. You are a tenant/lessee, in which case you will need to provide a copy of your current lease to prove residency. A maximum of 2 permits will be issued for rental properties.
7. Mobile App Zones may not be eligible.
8. Multi-family housing may not be eligible.
 - Residents in the downtown district are not eligible.

Application for a Residential Parking Permit may be filled out online by visiting www.cityoflacrosse.org/parking or made at the City of La Crosse Police Department, Monday through Thursday between the hours of 8:00AM and 4:00PM. You will receive an email after your application is processed and the permit has been issued. Permits will be mailed to the address listed on the application.

RESIDENTIAL PERMIT TYPES:

- Permits available for homeowners and their direct family that reside at the same address.
- Permits available for tenants/lessees. Maximum of 2 permits issued per rental property address.

RESIDENTIAL PERMIT GUIDELINES:

- Residential Parking Permits are valid June 1 through May 31 annually, regardless of permit start date.
- A Residential Parking Permit is valid only when visibly and properly displayed.
- Permits are not transferable to another person or vehicle.
- The permit is valid only on the block for which it is issued.
- The permit shall not guarantee or reserve to the holder a parking space; rather, once a parking spot has been found, the holder of the permit may remain at that spot beyond the two-hour limit.
- The permit applies only to the period of time when the parking limitation is in effect. Typically, the hours are from 8AM to 6PM.
- A permit does not authorize the holder to park a motor vehicle or let it stand in such places or during such times as the stopping, standing, or parking of motor vehicles is prohibited or set aside for specified types of vehicles, nor does it exempt the holder from observing any traffic regulation other than the specified hourly limit.
- Examples of traffic regulations and other parking regulations:
 - Municipal Code Sec 44-111. Emergency alternate side parking. Whenever emergency alternate side parking is declared, alternate side parking regulations shall immediately be in effect on all streets in the City of La Crosse. Such regulations shall apply as follows:
 - (1) On odd-numbered days, vehicles shall only be parked, stopped or left standing on that side of the street having odd-numbered addresses.
 - (2) On even-numbered days, vehicles shall only be parked, stopped or left standing on that side of the street having even-numbered addresses.
 - (3) The provisions of this section shall not supersede more restrictive parking regulations such as no parking zones, etc. in effect in the City including without limitation.
 - (4) It shall be considered prima facie evidence that upon six hours after public notification of the start of alternate side parking, all sections of this ordinance are fully enforceable. Ignorance is not considered a valid defense for a violation.
 - (5) Exemptions. Vehicles are exempt from alternate side parking under snow emergencies declarations where parking is normally permitted only on one side of the street and in the downtown business district.
 - (6) The provisions of this section shall only be in effect from 12:00 a.m. until 6:00 p.m.
 - A motor vehicle may not be stored on a City street for more than 48 hours.

LEGAL INFORMATION: Any person who falsely represents him/herself as being eligible for a Residential Parking Permit or who furnishes any false information in the application to the Police Department in order to obtain a Residential Parking Permit shall be in violation of the regulation.
